6.5. Key signing key roll-over

Each RZ KSK will be scheduled to be rolled over through a key ceremony as required, or after 5 years of operation.

Timeline

- First attempt at rolling 11 Oct 2017.
- Postponed until there was a better understanding of signalled issues (was 1 year)
 - New KSK remains published in the root zone
- KSK rolled on 11 October 2018
- revoked on 11 January 2019

Observations

- There is still a shortage of reliable data regarding what is available in resolvers and what impact resolver failure may have on end users (who, how many, etc)
- Not everything was smooth even if there are claims that it was.
- *exempli gratia*: ISP in Ireland. <https://www.rte.ie/news/2018/1013/1002966-eir-outage/>
 - ~20% of Ireland's Internet users/ .022% of Internet
